Candle Star

Cut 8 pieces of lace 18cm from point to point and ribbon is 3.5 wide



Fold and glue points together, glue in a circle onto a round piece of cardboard then glue candle in centre

This one leaves you guessing what it is all about! Made by Girl Guiding UK it begins by taking in the 1940's and then you are whisked off on a visit to Our Chalet in the early days. Lady Baden Powell makes an appearance towards the end of the film. This is a favourite film.

You can't help liking Them 21.20 mins

An Australian Guiding film made for recruiting while aiming at debunking some of the myths about Girl Guides. Senator Kay Patterson as a young leader can be spotted showing some international visitors around Sydney Harbour. Colour in this film is no longer as vibrant as it was when originally released.

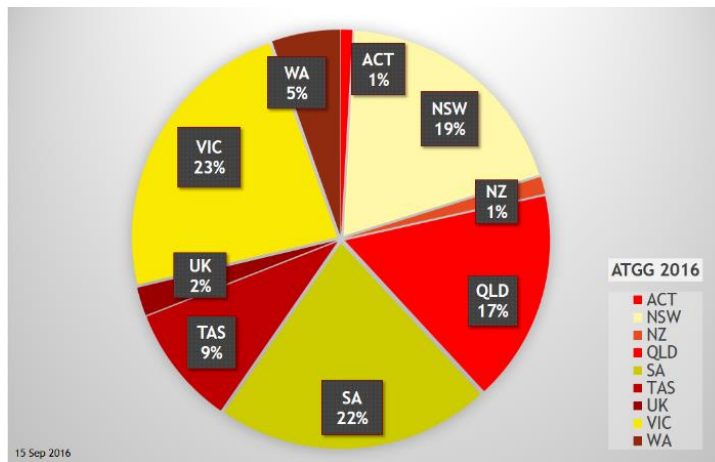
