After the session, Leaders will be able to:

- Identify their own values and beliefs
- Incorporate the Promise and Law into the unit program.
- Develop the girls' understanding of the place of the Promise and Law in their lives appropriate to their age and stage of development.

General notes: Encourage Leaders/Managers to include the Promise and Law in the whole program, not make it a separate activity. The list of activities is under the heading of the Elements but could be ungrouped or grouped by Fundamentals or aspects of the Promise and Law. There is one Australian Girl Guide Promise and one Law.

Does it reflect something extremely important to you? Activity 2: Give out a copy of Values spreadsheet and definitions sheet. Check off your top 10 values on the spreadsheet. Prioritize your values 1-10. For each of your top 10 values, ask yourself: "Am I living my life according to this value?" You can use the sheet which defines each value to ascertain if you are living your life to the value. For example, if one of your values is 'family,' ask yourself if you are spending enough quality time with your family. If another value is adventure, ask yourself if you are taking the time to do things that are fun, things that excite you. 10 mins	Beliefs & Spiritual development	As the concept of abstract thought develops we grow in our ability to develop our beliefs and spirituality. Again: We need to talk to girls about what they believe and value. This is much easier if we have had time to reflect on our own values. You need values and self-esteem to develop beliefs. 'What do you believe' is a powerful question to ask. Share some of the beliefs of girls. Compare girls' beliefs to the Promise and Law. Are the girls' beliefs reflected in the words of the Promise and Law? What values do the quotes encompass? Connecting personal beliefs with P&L: Compare girls' beliefs to the Promise and Law. Are the girls' beliefs reflected in the words of the Promise and Law? What values do the quotes encompass? Chose a couple of the girls' beliefs and as a patrol brainstorm how you would continue the conversation. What questions would you ask - o Open ended – How is reflected or seen through our Guide Promise? o Closed – Is an aspect of our Promise? o Leading - If you think that, then what actions demonstrate this?
