# Learn about flags

Learn about flags, colours, standards and their terminology:

- What are the components of flags and standards?
- Find examples of the difference between 'flags' and 'colours'
- Learn how to care for and store flags and standards. What are the procedures for disposing of flags and standards?

# Symbols and legends

Research stories and legends associated with flags and standards.

What is the composition and meaning of:

- Australian national flag
- the State flags
- Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island flags
- World Flag
- the Chief Commissioner's and/or State Commissioner's Standards
- Unit Colours

### Flag ceremonies

Visit the *It's an Honour* website <a href="http://www.itsanhonour.gov.au/symbols/flag.cfm">http://www.itsanhonour.gov.au/symbols/flag.cfm</a> to find out about flag protocol. Research the protocol for using flags and standards in different circumstances:

- at a Guide ceremony
- at a committee meeting other than when the flag
   is on a pike or on a pulley
- at the unveiling of a plaque

- at a funeral of a Guiding member
- on ANZAC Day
- in a church
- when several different national and Guide Flags are involved

#### Train a colour party to

- understand their duties including the role of the bearer and escorts
- carry a flag on a pike
- raise and lower a flag on a fixed flag pole
- parade flags or standards at a Unit ceremony, a camp, a District, Region or State event, an ANZAC Day ceremony, a church or a community function

#### Add activities

- Design and make a Unit or Patrol flag
- Make a flagpole for camp or a miniature for the patrol
- Look at flags of the world. How many have the Union Jack or the Southern Cross? What colours and symbols are used and why?
