

On 20th February, 42 intrepid Trefoil Guild members and several husbands, embarked on the beautiful cruise ship Queen Elizabeth at Circular Quay in Sydney. We sailed to and around New Zealand for 12 nights. We held our 'Thinking Day Ceremony' on board on 22nd February. Our group's 'Trefoil Guild at Sea' T-Shirts, were fantastic PR for Guiding and encouraged some overseas passengers to join us for Thinking Day too!





Port Chalmers was our first Port of Call where four of us met with the New Zealand Trefoil Guild Co-ordinator, Sally Mason who lives in Dunedin.

Nine TG members (including 1 husband) performed in the Passenger Choir and wore their navy and red Thinking Day at Sea T-Shirts.

We returned to Sydney on 4th March, 34 of our Group disembarked sadly to return home.

Eight of our group remained on board Queen Elizabeth and a further 18 Trefoil Guild members and several husbands joined us in Sydney to sail down to Hobart and Port Arthur. On 5th March, we held another Thinking Day at Sea Ceremony on our way to Hobart. Tasmanian Trefoil Guild members greeted us in Hobart to show us around their beautiful city. After a most successful and exciting adventure of cruising around the Tasman Sea, we disembarked when we returned to Sydney on 9th March all safe and sound.

The annual meeting was held last month in Bangkok, Thailand, and was chaired by Brian Jackson (NSW BP Guild member). This was the first meeting of the new region committee so it included informative updates and explanations for all, as well as administrative issues. Opening address was delivered by Ahmad Rusdi, Chairman, AsPac Region, WOSM (also the current Indonesian Ambassador to Thailand). All countries provided reports covering recent activities, whilst Greg Davies (Australian delegate) delivered the Australian update report as part of a photo slide show prepared by Richard Stuart Smith (our International Commissioner). There was an updated report in relation to the '2024 Vision' which covered membership growth and development throughout the AsPac region. Currently Australian membership numbers are in excess of 40% covering the whole AsPac ISGF region, which is why Australia is looked at for continued input and contributions, and also why we need to assist in the development and growth within the Fellowship throughout the AsPac region. 2015 has stepped down (to concentrate more on ISGF AsPac Treasurer role), so we are now looking for another representative from Australia to join this team and continue the development work.

The main highlights of the meeting was the evening river dinner cruise through the Bangkok central areas, the opening address and input from Ahmad Rusdi (and commitment to assist with formation of Thailand ISGF team), along with the ongoing international fellowship experience of catching up with our overseas guiding / scouting friends.



Next year's meeting will be held in Jakarta, Indonesia. The next AsPac regional gathering will be held in Kuala Lumpar, Malaysia in August 2021.
