GENERAL

- 4. Which currency is used in Ghana?
- 5. Ghana is described as a land of gold and cocoa. Why is this so?
- 6. Add to your international recipe collection by making and sampling "Jollof".



GIRL GUIDING

- 1. To which World Guiding Region does Ghana belong? When did Ghana join WAGGGS? Is there a connection with WOSM?
- 2. What is Kusafiri? How is this connected to Ghana? Locate a picture of Kusafiri.
- 3. Share the Ghanaian Promise and explain the meaning of the Ghanaian Promise Badge.
- 4. Approximately how many Ghanaian Girl Guides are there? What are the names given to the different sections of Girl Guiding in Ghana?
- 5. Draw the Ghanaian Guide uniform.
- 6. Play the traditional game of 'Antoakyire' with your Guide Unit.
- 7. Send a greeting card to Ghana Girl Guides at:
 - The Guide House
 - Makola
 - Accra Central
 - Ghana





IN DEPTH

Research the following aspects of culture and incorporate them into your unit program

- 1. Traditional arts and crafts (e.g. wood carving and handwoven kente cloth).
- 2. Traditional music styles and dance forms such as ampe.
- 3. Make a collection of traditional Ghanaian recipes.
- 4. Research some key facts about the history of Ghana can you see any similarities with Australian history?
- 5. Kwame Alexander is an award winning Ghanaian novelist. Consider reading one of his works eg "The Door of No Return" (for Olaves and older Guides).
